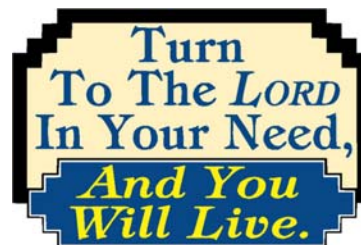

This policy is not used as a measure of contributions but of stewardship and attendance. **Faith Direct** provides enrolled families with personalized offertory cards that must be placed in the collection basket as a sign of their stewardship commitment. Please make it a practice of placing your **Faith Direct** offertory cards in the collection basket on a regular basis in place of your stewardship envelopes.


What is CLOW? After the opening prayers the celebrant calls the children forward to dismiss them for the Children Liturgy of the Word. The children dismiss to a room in church to hear the same readings being read in Mass translated into an easy-to-understand child's version. Questions and activities are included during this time to provide instructional material to help relate the Bible readings to a young person's life.

An Old Testament Story of Courage and Faith

Sibling rivalry. Remember the good ole days of fighting in the backseat of the car and shouting “Mom, he’s touching me!”? Or, I remember beating up on my younger brother until he was a young teen and he hit me back hard enough that it knocked the air out of me. Well, Joseph’s brothers took sibling rivalry to a whole new level! Joseph was the 11th child of Jacob (who was the son of Isaac, Isaac was the son of Abraham) and he was Jacob’s favorite son. Perhaps you have heard the story of the coat of many colors which Jacob gave to Joseph (Genesis 37:3). Joseph’s brothers resented him because he was the favored son and Joseph wasn’t always tactful about his favored position in the family. You see, Joseph once had a dream about his brothers bowing down to him and he didn’t hesitate to tell his brothers about his dream (of course, wouldn’t you?). Joseph’s arrogance further irritated his siblings.

So, the brothers apprehended Joseph and threw him down into a pit to die. One of the eleven brothers named, Judah, decided maybe this punishment was a bit harsh and selling Joseph into slavery might be a better idea. While I’m thinking of it, did you know that the tribes of Israel are named after Joseph’s brothers, as well as Joseph’s two sons? (Genesis chapter 49).

Joseph was taken into Egypt where he was sold to a wealthy man named Potiphar. All was going well for Joseph, as Joseph found favor with his master and was made an overseer of Potiphar’s house. But then Potiphar’s wife decided she would like to have Joseph as a boyfriend. When Joseph denied her advances, he found himself in prison because Potiphar’s wife made up lies about him to her husband.

By this point not only would I resent my brothers, but I think I would be downright angry about the way things were going for me! But Joseph kept his courage and faith in God and once again found favor with his captor. And this is where our story of Joseph will begin at VBS.

As I ponder this story of Joseph, I find myself wishing I had Joseph’s tenacity and charisma. But, I think that could be the point of the story. We should learn from Joseph that no matter the situation in our lives we should respond with faith and trust that God will deliver us. Not only will God care for us, but He might even use our situation to bless others. Such as if we follow Joseph’s story further, we learn that Joseph is the reason the Israelites ended up in Egypt and later Moses rises to the challenge of leading them out of Egypt and into the Promise Land (see Exodus).

I’m excited about the impact that this story can have on our children, as well as the adults and teens helping with VBS as we follow Joseph’s journey during the week and view it through his perspective. Will you pray with me and ask God’s blessing on our VBS program which begins next Sunday, July 18th? May God’s word guide us, shape us and help us to know Him better.
